Access for the Community

The space should be available beyond the school. Access is wanted for local residents, families and groups.



Range of activities and flexibility

A variety of activities should take place on the pitch, providing a flexible space to meet different community needs.



Concerns about noise and impact

Questions were asked about how the space would be managed to regulate its use and address any noise and disturbance, especially at particular times.



Opportunity to shape the design

Residents wanted to be involved and influence the project.



Keeping informed with the next steps

Residents wanted clear communication on what happens next.

WE DID

The multi-use games area is designed for dual use – school use during the day and community access outside school hours. A community-use approach will ensure more benefits for local residents.

The proposed multi-use games area will support a range of sports and activities. Insights gained from the consultation will inform how the space can be used and programmed.

All feedback was documented throughout the consultation process and used to inform design, planning, and management considerations. Ongoing engagement with residents will support the resolution of concerns and further refine the proposal.

A full consultation was delivered, including a survey and engagement activities which will contribute to shaping the proposal.

The consultation findings and recommendations will be finalised ahead of seeking approvals. Updates will be provided on Commonplace as well as engagement with residents and stakeholders will continue throughout delivery.
